#### **Fox Class reminders**

# Recurring D&V

We have instances of recurring diarrhoea and vomiting, particularly in Squirrel Class, with some children now having had four bouts of it. We are monitoring the situation in school and are being vigilant with handwashing and good hygiene routines. It is important to break this cycle that children are not sent back into school until 48 hours after their last bout of sickness. Your reinforcement of good hygiene messages at home would be much appreciated. Many thanks.

# **Collectable Cards in School**

There are a number of children bringing football and Pokemon cards into school and this is presenting us with several issues that we would like to bring to your attention. It is great to see children swapping cards and socialising in groups to look at collections but we have been made aware that some cards have gone missing and this is causing children to be upset. Staff have spoken to classes regarding cards going missing and emphasised that this is unacceptable and not something we want happening in our school. We have talked about trusting people and doing the right thing and behaving in a way that is morally correct. Unfortunately, the cards are highly desirable and sometimes children do not make the correct moral decisions when it comes to something like this.

Whilst we do not want to say children can't bring cards into school, we would advise that large amounts of cards, full folders or more desirable cards are left at home. If children choose to bring cards into school, we would ask that they are responsible for their safekeeping. We would ask you to talk to your children regarding trading and swapping as we have several incidents of this not happening correctly or children changing their minds and arguments occurring.

Sadly, if there are any further incidents we may have to say that cards are not allowed in school. Thank you for your support.
