



## Clawton Primary School Newsletter | 19<sup>th</sup> April 2021

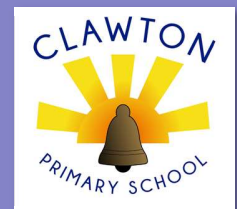
Dear Parents/ Carers,
