Impact—What?

PSHE will create reflective, creative individuals through discussion, videos and games to appeal to all types of learners.

Children will develop a rich vocabulary linking character to their learning and can use this to talk about PSHE.

Children will meet end of year expectations through the comprehensive planning adapted from SCARF.

Children will be confident within the 3 subheadings; Health and Wellbeing, Living in the Wider World and Relationships.

Children will believe they can achieve, feel a sense of belonging to the local and global community and actively seek to become inspiring change makers.

The children will be aware of the needs to others and themselves both physically and mentally.

Implementation—How?

PSHE will be taught weekly using half termly units

PSHE will be taught through discrete class sessions as well as through one off whole school collaborative lessons.

Planned in days that cover topics such as Children's Mental Health week, World Mental Health week and other national days.

PSHE will be taught through stories in all year groups.

PSHE will be linked across other subjects including Science, computing, DT, Geography, History, Music, Art, PE and RE. It also links closely with English and Maths. These can be found on the SCARF website.

The school will follow SCARF using their mixed age planning and 3 year rolling program.

Staff will use See-saw and twitter to engage with parents and celebrate out learning.

I have worked closely with the Character lead to ensure that we have a PSHE curriculum that is virtue led. Ensuring a layered curriculum and direct links to Character Education.

Children and staff will record learning in class floor books.

Teaching of RSE across all years and statutory year 6 elements.
