Squirrels class chose to have a sponsored silence to raise money for Edukid. They showed amazing determination with this challenge and raised a huge amount of money for their sponsored child!



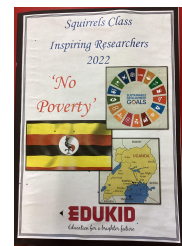
Squirrels have developed their curiosity when going on class adventures to Rosemoor and Beer Mill. They showed excellent respect during their visits and compassion for living things.

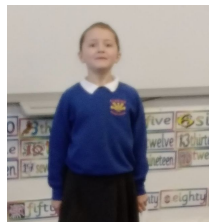

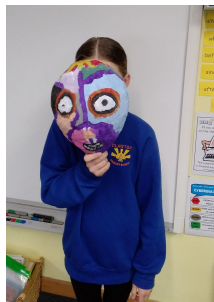




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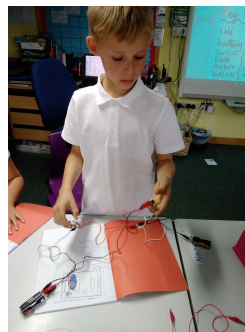
## We are Badgers Class (Y5/6) from **Clawton Primary School**
