




Fox Class – Summer Term 1

Romans - how do organisations impact on citizens' wellbeing, safety and prosperity?

Academic:

In maths, the children will be continuing their work on Multiplication and division before moving onto length, perimeter and area. In Literacy the Fox class will be looking at poems which explore form; they will then look at persuasive writing where they will be writing a persuasive advert for a Roman invention, using knowledge they have learnt in History.

In History, the children will be exploring the Romans and how they changed life in England when they invaded. This will build on the knowledge children formed in Autumn on invaders. They will be looking at what it was like to live in Rome and how the Romans brought these customs and inventions to England. They will also find out what it was like for the Celts during the Iron Age and we will be making an edible Roman road!



In Science the children will be looking at sound by looking at how musical instruments make sound and how this sound travels to the ear.

Character:

Over this half-term we will be focusing on the character virtues of honesty, confidence and cooperation. Explicit teaching about these virtues will be mostly through assemblies. This will also be supported through PSHE lessons where the children will be learning about themselves, first aid and making choices and how these affect others.

Community:

The children will be having a day in the garden planting and weeding.

With the brighter weather the plants should have a chance to grow beautifully. Different classes are all contributing to the garden with a real community spirit.

Digital and Innovation:

In computing the children will be continuing their work on coding. This term they will be using scratch to create animations and games.

We also have a day of DT planned where children will be using their knowledge of electrical circuits from Autumn 2 to create a museum display about a part of Roman life incorporating lights.
