### How can we support a Ugandan community?

#### Academic:

- As masters of maths we will explore fractions, place value, time and money.
- As explorers we will learn about life in a Ugandan village and how it differs to our own. We will try some exotic fruits, learn about how they grow and turn them into tasty smoothies!
- As authors we will write a set of instructions for how to make an exotic fruit smoothie, describe story settings and write a recount about our craft market.
- Our personal, social and emotional development will focus on valuing differences between families and homes. As Global Citizens we will organise a craft market to raise money for Nick's education.
- As physically active learners we will perform African dance and practise for our sports day races.
- As artists we will explore weaving and create our own versions of Tinga Tinga street art.



#### Character:

Our focus virtues are **citizenship, caring, volunteering, gratitude and reflection**. We will:

- Explore these virtues in our whole school and class based assemblies.
- Share stories with these virtues as the main theme.
- Celebrate any virtues we see 'in action' by placing a leaf on our character tree.
- Participate in enrichment activities to help us gain our Inspiring Changemaker Award. We will be Inspiring Adventurers by visiting Crooklets Beach, Inspiring Researchers by learning about life in a Ugandan village and Inspiring Skill Builders by developing our cooking and weaving skills. We will also be Inspiring Volunteers by taking part in a beach clean.



#### Community:

Children will:

- Explore the UN Sustainability Goal 'Quality Education'. What helps and hinders our learning? How can we support those in other countries who don't have access to quality education?
- Explore where some of our food comes from.
- Visit Crooklets Beach and learn about how we can help protect our coastlines.



#### Digital and Innovation:

This term the children will have opportunities to:

- Create a Tinga Tinga weaving.
- Make African clay pots and jewellery.
- Design an exotic fruit smoothie.
- Take part in African drumming and dance.
- Revisit computer skills of word processing and painting.
