Owls Class - Where Do I Live?

Academic: This week Owls have been looking at what made their homes special. As our Talk for Writing text was about 'A Wonderful World' Owls have been looking at where we live and what makes it a wonderful place to live in. Looking at space, the Earth, the UK, Devon, Clawton and then finally their own homes. We had answers such as their family is wonderful, trees, rainbows and flowers. We then looked at Christmas and had a discussion about what makes Christmas wonderful for them. Owls made a group college and stuck all their favourite things about Christmas.

So, Christmas has arrived in preschool, letters to Santa and snow play have been the focus this week. Owls have been busy cutting out pictures of some toys and items they would like for Christmas and then posting their letters in the post box.

In Maths, hot chocolate was on the menu! Well, marshmallows mainly. They have been counting their marshmallows that go in their hot chocolate pictures. The best part of this activity was actually getting to eat the marshmallows at the end of the activity.

Character: This first term has flown by and the children have been excellent at displaying many character virtues. Hot chocolate rewards are coming in thick and fast with the whole Owl class to receive one from Mrs Steyn next week for their courage and critical thinking. The children had completed a group poster of all the things that make Christmas wonderful for them, and wanted to show some of the teachers and big children.

This week Herbie & Rex enjoyed their hot chocolate reward for displaying the character virtue of HELPFULNESS. Both owls are always offering a helping hand when needed, and have done some super tidying up! Well done boys!

Community: Owls are all super excited for Christmas this year! We had a Christmas Tree kindly donated to us from Mole Valley Farmers and the children enjoyed decorating the tree with tinsel and baubles. They enjoyed making a star too! To say thank you, Owls made Mole Valley Farmers a thank you card.

Owls enjoyed having a special visitor in this week from Badger class, Oscar Barriball came in and played a stringed instrument called a Dulcimer. The Dulcimer is a fretted string instrument of the Zither family, typically with three or four strings.

This week, we have also enjoyed our Christmas craft fayre. It was lovely to see the children's creations. We made some Christmas apple chutney, magical reindeer food and bags of Christmas sweets. We

also have a reindeer who needs a name! This is still ongoing as we have a few names left. So if you want to have a guess or another go, please pop into preschool before or after school to choose your name! We will be announcing the winning name next week before we break up!

Digital and Innovation: Through their exploration about how houses are made - Owls have loved the story 'The Three Little Pigs' They have been re-enacting the story building their own houses. They have used different resources and loved using the plastic bricks and building walls. They had a box as a cooking pot where the wolf fell in and burnt his bottom! We had a discussion about what their own houses looked like and what they were made from.



















Academic:

The year 2 children have made a fantastic start on writing their own versions of 'The Town Mouse and the Country Mouse.' They are bringing all of their previous learning together and using their plans to ensure they incorporate expanded noun phrases, adverbs, past tense verbs, third person pronouns and time conjunctions into their stories. They will now respond to feedback and edit their work ready for display.

Character:

Last week we enjoyed an environmental workshop from Devon Waste and thought about ways in which we can be carers of our world by recycling or reusing our rubbish. We explored a variety of objects and sorted them according to the materials they were made from. We then listened to ways in which we can take part in recycling at home and enjoyed making a poster to stick on our fridges to help


remind us how our rubbish should be sorted. Sally was very impressed with how creative and resourceful we are when reusing our rubbish for iunk modellina!


Fox Class


Academic:

Over the last couple of weeks Fox Class have been writing letters to the council about the speed of the cars that drive past our school. This is part of our Formal Letter writing unit. The children have written some fantastic letters and have been resilient and motivated to continue. In Maths this week we have been continuing our Multiplication and division unit looking at Sharing and grouping and recognising the difference between the two.

In Geography the children have been looking at earthquakes and Tsunamis.

In Science the children have been looking at the properties of rocks and the difference between different kinds of rocks.
