Owls Class - How do I get around?

Academic:

For the last couple of weeks, we have kicked off our learning journey about transport and how we get around. We have looked at land and sea transport so far, investigating the various modes of









transport for land and sea. We have discovered that some transport can be used on both!

Owls have been dynamic designers and have designed cars and boats from junk modelling. We have been super scientists too by investigating FLOAT OR SINK. Finding out which item would float and which would sink! We found out that heavy items sink and light items float. However, we did discover an item that did both! The





bucket...when empty, it floated but when it was full of water...it sank! We added in some mini maths to the mix by asking the Owls why the item sank or floated? Was it because the item was heavy or light?

For our mark making, we have made tracks on paper by using pens taped to various vehicles. Making tracks in flour (This was snow!)











For our Klassen this week, we made banana boats! A very popular snack was enjoyed by all!

This is proving to be a very popular topic to investigate! Next week we will be moving on to how we get around in the air!

Character:

2025 - a new year and new starts, we have welcomed four new Owls to preschool this term. Owls have been amazing with welcoming them. They have shown friendliness, caring, helpfulness







and have been very curious! We have been refreshing our carpet expectations too. Resourcefulness has been the focus of the whole school and Owls have also been focusing on this virtue too. Digital and Innovation:



Researching different types of transport has been highly enjoyed by Owls these last couple of weeks. We have researched different types of land and sea transport. Owls couldn't believe it when I said that trains can go underwater! They kept on telling me that they go on land. So, we researched the channel tunnel and the trains that go



under the sea! Our new talk for writing text is called "The Train Ride" written by June Crebbin and illustrated by Stephen Lambert. It is a lovely little book with amazing illustrations. It is simple and interesting for children of all ages. Owls have picked up this story well and next week we will be moving on to retelling the story using story maps only!







Hedgehogs and Squirrels - When did we learn to fly?

Academic:

The children have been really interested to learn about the Wright Brothers and how they became the heroes of the sky. This week we read a story about how they achieved their dream of being the first men in the world to fly. Groups then created a tableau to show the moment their glider took off and were encouraged to think about what Orville, Wilbur, the photographer and members of the public were thinking or saying at the time. We agreed that they were very courageous, determined and resilient men!



Character:

As the weather has got colder, we have been thinking about how we can use the character virtue of service to help the birds in our local community. We have been busy making some feeders to go in our apple tree and have already enjoyed watching some robins and sparrows eating their breakfast and lunch. We are now waiting patiently to spot the starlings that usually come to visit us during the winter.



Community:

We have thoroughly enjoyed our visits from Plymouth Argyle Football Club over the past couple of weeks. Dylan and Carwyn have been so much fun and they are amazing with the children. So far we have been learning how to dribble and kick the ball at a target.





Digital and Innovation:

The children have been really inspired by our topic about flight and have been busy at the Creation Station designing their own model planes. It has been wonderful to see them using lots of skills such measuring, cutting, joining and evaluating. We love how they all look so different!











Fox Class - Why did the Romans Settle in Britain?

Academic:



This week in English we have been focusing on planning and building a bank of words and ideas to include when we start writing our Historical Stories.

In Maths we are coming to the end of our Multiplication and Division unit and next week the children will be moving on to Measurement and looking at area.

In History we have started looking at where Rome is on the map. Then we looked at the key words 'settlement' 'invasion' and 'empire'.



Character:

Academic:
