


## Hedgehogs and Squirrels - When did we learn to fly?

## Academic:


This half term the children have worked incredibly hard on two different pieces of writing. The first one being a historical narrative and the second a third person narrative. The children really delved into their imaginations to create these stories. In Maths this half term the children have really

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focused on their timetables. They are all improving on their soundcheck each week and are really starting to recall those answers quickly. They have also completed a unit on area. In History the children have enjoyed learning about how the Romans came to Britain and how a lot of things the Romans invented are still used today.

In Science the children have been looking at

Shadows and Light and how Shadows are formed and why shadows change throughout the day.



### **Character:**

This half term the children have focused on a number of Virtues. Resourcefulness, creativity, aspiration and leadership. Many other virtues have been spotted throughout school by many staff members, which have been recognised throughout our Celebration Assemblies.



## Community:

This half term has been a busy one full of community spirit. We have ventured on a trip to Rosemoor for a sculpture expedition, we welcomed Bradworthy Year 3 and 4s in for a sports

## **Digital and Innovation:**

For our DT project this half term, the focus has been on wearable technology. In these lessons, the children learnt to code a virtual Micro-bit. Then designed their own piece of technology for Children to wear in the winter months when it is dark. They also focused on a selling strategy to make sure that their product would get the best sales.

### Academic:

Last week we completed our letters to prospective investors in our weird and wonderful inventions. These are written in Dragon Den style! They are written using formal language, begin with a rhetorical question, include fronted adverbials, subjunctive verb forms and clear paragraphs.


In maths we have completed our unit on fractions and have now moved onto decimals up to 3 decimal places.

We have continued with our French and can now order simple food and drinks in a café and ask for the bill!


### **Character:**

Over the last week we have been reading the book 'I AM NOT A LABEL' by Cerrie Burnell. It is an inspiring anthology of tales about disabled artists, athletes, activists, thinkers, writers, performers and dreamers. This book has made all of us think about our own levels of resilience and what we could achieve if we really put our minds to it.



#### **Community:**

The children enjoyed showing off their pop up books at the reading café this week. They have all worked really hard to make bridges, flaps, twirly parts, sliders and much more. They have also learnt about layers and spacers and how to create a high quality product.



## **Digital and Innovation:**

Over the last two weeks we have continued to learn about Space. We have made simple sundials and learnt how these work to tell the time. We have also looked at the terrible amount of litter that we have put in Space. The children have then thought about how they could design a rubbish collecting machine to clean up Space and collect up all the waste floating around. They thought about using giant magnets and nets but then realised that some of things would burn up on re-entering earth's atmosphere.
