- Learn about ocean life and the sea creatures that live there.

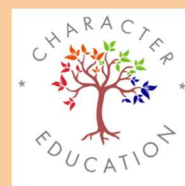

The new talk for writing story is 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' written by Eric Carle.

The Very Hungry Caterpillar is a children's picture book from 1969! It is designed, illustrated and written by Eric Carle. The plot is all about the life cycle of a caterpillar to butterfly. A tiny caterpillar with a very hungry appetite embarks on an adventure before turning into a beautiful butterfly.
